The Metcalfe County Fiscal Court met on Thursday, February 27th with everyone in attendance.

The agenda was adopted and the minutes from the February 13th meeting were approved as written after motions were made by Magistrate Ronnie Miller and seconded by Magistrate Daniel

Bragg.

The first item of business was a presentation of excess fees to the fiscal court by the Metcalfe County Clerk, Shannon Fields.

A Century of Success

It is a game of strategy and concentration with a long and varied history. Chess has evolved greatly from its earliest form in India as a game called chaturanga played before the 600s AD.

The modern chess version of today didn't come into existence until the 1900s. Before that time not even the pieces were standardized.

In May of last year, the Chess Club held its first meeting at the Metcalfe County Public Library. At first, they met a couple of times a week, but then decided upon meeting each Monday from 3 - 5p.m.

The founder of the group is Nathaniel Gutierrez who explained that he

That's the total number of years that Nolan Group Media has been in operation, and the Kentucky State Senate recognized the century milestone on February 26. Senate President Robert Stivers, a Republican elected to serve in Clay County, Kentucky, delivered the resolution on the Senate floor.

The American Dream, a phrase rooted in the fabric of America emphasizing the freedom and opportunity to achieve success, is one of which the late James Frank Nolan seized in 1925 when he embarked on a newspaper career journey, ultimately leading to what is known today as the Nolan Group Media.
