

Green-Taylor Water District is proposing to change its tariff to state the following: "When a customer makes a payment by credit card or debit card, the processor (not the District) will assess a convenience fee for providing this service. Prior to processing the transaction, the customer will be informed of the fee amount." The amount of the convenience fee assessed by the processor will be actual cost."
