
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CAROLYN HAX Groom thinks eloping would be easiest



Sinner, Sabalenka earn top seeds at French Open

The 2025 French Open begins Sunday with topranked Jannik Sinner and Aryna Sabalenka as the top seeds.

The men's and women's draws for this year's second Grand Slam tournament were announced on Thursday.

Defending champions Carlos Alcaraz and Iga Swiatek are seeded second and fifth, respectively, for the clay-court major at Roland Garros in Paris.

Sinner, who returned from a doping suspension this month and lost to Alcaraz in Sunday's Italian Open final, will begin his quest for his first French Open title against France's Arthur Rinderknech.

Sinner is 16-5 at Roland Garros after reaching the semifinals last year. The 23-year-old Italian is a three-time Grand Slam

winner with titles at the U.S. Open in 2024 and Australian Open in 2024 and 2025.

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
