# How should I light my exterior?

hen the sun sets and the deck light pops on, an unseen design element brings new life to your landscape: outdoor lighting.

Not only does outdoor lighting improve the look of your home, it's also an important safety feature of your home. Here's how you can use outdoor lighting around your home for function, safety and design.

#### Make walkways safe

If you're not sure where to start with your outdoor lighting project, start with the walkways. Lighting your walkways and your patio will improve both safety as well as beauty, and these are the areas that you use the most. If you don't want to light your entire pathway, you can mark the start or end of your walkway with a post light.

#### Consider color styles

When thinking about the type of lighting you want to use for the outside of your home, you can choose from warm lighting, all the way to cool lighting, depending on where you want to use it. Warm lighting works best on pathways and patios to make a very welcoming environment, whereas the cooler light setting works well around plants to mimic the moon.

For best results, light both the first and second floors so your house looks full-sized and balanced. Keep light angles as close to the house as possible to cut back on unnecessary light spill and neighborhood glare.

### Light up the landscape

This is where outdoor lighting really sparkles. Want to make that ornamental tree pop? Place a spotlight at its base to draw the eye up. Want soft, natural moonlight effects? Tuck warm lights behind shrubs or along walkways. Besides beauty, landscape lighting adds a layer of safety, helping define flower beds and pathways — and deterring anyone or anything that shouldn't be wandering

## through your yard. Light up water features

Waterfalls, ponds and streams transform at night with the right lighting. Downlights positioned nearby or waterproof submersible lights inside the water capture shimmering reflections.
