said allowing kids to try new foods in fun ways is key. During an early POP Club session this summer, kids got to create their own hungry caterpillar by skewering fruit.

“We try to get the kids to try fruits or vegetables that they’ve never tried before,” she said. “... Putting them in an art form, I think kids are more apt to try them that way. My

own kids, when they were little, I know that they would try something if it looked like something else, or if it was art. I think it’s a good way to get kids to try things that they normally wouldn’t try.”

Amber Metcalf brings her two daughters to POP Club. She said she loves having a place to bring her daughter where they are learning and interacting with the world around them. This year is the first the program has implemented the story walk, an

element Metcalf said her daughters enjoy.

“She’s big into the crafts, so she likes doing the crafts,” Metcalf said. “And this one (her other daughter) loves the food part, to try to out snacks. It’s just really family friendly, and it’s good for them, and gets us out of the house.”

Casie Heintz brought her three children to POP Club for the first time, with all three loving

the experience. Heintz said the area they live in doesn’t have much for children to do, so she aims to take her kids to parks and places that have activities for them to join. POP Club was the perfect opportunity for them to do it as a family.

“There’s a lot of activities, and honestly, the fact that it’s free, that’s awe-

some,” she said. And they like it. They like getting out and looking at all the plants, and they want to look at all the vegetables, flowers. ... They are kids that would prefer fruits and veggies over chocolate or snack cakes. They’re excited.”

POP Club will be at

the Farmer’s Market two more times this summer on June 27 and July 1.

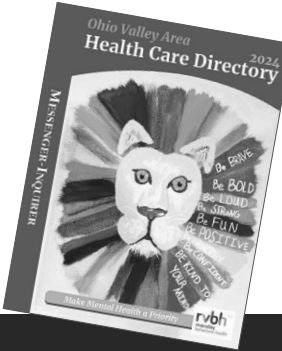
