Historical marker honoring early Letcher settler missing a 2nd time

In a county where a large of the population can trace their lineage to veterans of Revolutionary War, one of the most disrespected men in these parts is ... a Revolutionary War veteran.

It's not that he's disrespected by his descendants, nor by history. In fact, he is revered as one of the founding fathers of Letcher County. But despite his status as one of the first permanent settlers in the area, Archelous Craft just can't get a break.

He was recognized on historical marker near Crafts Colly for years as a veteran of the Battle of Hanging Rock and the Battle of Eutaw Springs, the last battle in the Carolinas during the Revolution, but three years ago, the bronze marker disappeared entirely. And now, history repeats itself.

Design work may soon begin on new resort at Raven Rock

The EKY Heritage Foundation has issued a request for qualifications for an architecture and engineering firm to design a lodge-style convention center on top of Pine Mountain at Raven Rock, overlooking the city Jenkins.

The advertisement in this week's newspaper is seeking someone to design the 8,500 square-foot lodge with a 3,500 square-foot deck, a 100-space parking lot, an access road, and five miles of soft-surface hiking and biking trails. The design work will include all the infrastructure for the facility, and a trailhead with a vaulted toilet, similar to the one on Pine Mountain near Whitesburg.
