Shine lights, serve Kentucky for America250

The Kentucky Historical Society and the America250KY Committee joined in the nationwide issue of a call to action to all Kentuckians for Two Lights for Tomorrow. Two Lights for Tomorrow is a nationwide initiative for local governments and citizens to place two lights in their offices and homes on the evening of April 18 and follow up with a day of service on April 19. The event commemorates a famous event, allowing communities to celebrate the beginning of the fight for independence and is a time of service leading up to the 250th birthday of our great nation. April 18, 1775, is a night most learned about through Henry Wadsworth Longfellow’s immortalization of Paul Revere’s moonlit dash



on that fateful night. However, this event will also commemorate Jack Jouett’s 40-mile Virginia ride in June 1781 that prevented British troops from capturing then-Virginia Governor and future President Thomas Jefferson and the state’s General Assembly — essentially saving four Declaration of Independence signers. According to KHS, the lights serve to remind us of the call to service both Revere and Jouett felt toward their fellow citizens and how their actions still matter today as we work together

toward a more perfect union. Everyone is encouraged to seek ways to serve others in your community, whether it is volunteering to clean up a local park, cemetery, or historic site; participating in a local food drive; or writing thank-you letters to others in your community. Together, we can all find a way to meet the needs of our communities and local organizations say they can use the help. Tammy Heltsley, executive director of Open Hearts Open Hands Inc. in Lewisburg, said they are most in need of monetary or food donations of any kind. Denise McDonald, Logan County Good Samaritan Executive Director, said the pantry there is always in need of cereal, peanut butter, spaghetti sauce in cans, small bags of sugar and flour,

and canned vegetables, and that they can and will accept any donations.
