


Wes Elrod/News-Democrat & Leader Senior pitcher Tate McLean (11) pitched a full game for the Cougars.



LEGAL PUBLICATION OF ORDINANCE IN SUMMARY CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE, **KENTUCKY** ORDINANCE NO. 2025-02

AN ORDINANCE EQUATING THE CITY OF RUSSELLVILLE MAYORIAL COMPENSATION PURSUANT TO KRS 83A.075 AND THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT

In accordance with KRS 83A.060(9), the undersigned a licensed, practicing attorney in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, summarizes this Ordin ance as follows:

1) Effective January 1, 2025 the current annual salary of the Mayor shall be increased by 2.9%, pursuant to the pro-visions of KRS 83A.075 and the most recent Kentucky Department of Local Govern ment cost of living adjustment

2) The full text of this Ordin ance and its attachments is available for copying and inspection at the office of the Russellville City Clerk, 168 South Main Street, Rus-sellville, during normal business hours.

3) The City Council of Rus sellville, Kentucky enacted this Ordinance after a first reading conducted on the 18th day of March, 2025 and a second reading and passage on the 8th day of April, 2025.
