“We did play three games during that time, but we didn’t play well in the two games,” Turner said. “An ugly win is still a win.” Turner credited the defense with carrying his team in the two games. “I thought Avery Raikes defense was a key in the game against Boyle County,” he said. “We kept changing up defenders on their point guard and she had her way with almost every one of them. Avery stepped up.” There were other heroes as well for Taylor County, which improved to 11-4 with the two wins. Kennedy Deener, who sat out the opening game and then went to the bench with three fouls in the first half of the championship game,

scored 14 of her 16 points in the second half to help Taylor County break away from a 21-21 deadlock against Boyle County. “I thought Riley Sprowles had a big game on the boards,” Turner said. The senior grabbed 10 rebounds and scored five points in the second quarter to help keep the game close while Deener was on the bench. Kennedy Jackson had a pair of big games in the tournament, scoring a team high 17 points and pulling down 11 rebounds in the opener. She followed that up with 10 points in the championship game. Jaylee Vernon stepped into Deener’s spot against Lincoln County and scored 12 points. Raikes was also in double figures with 10.
