just that in improving to 10-4 on the season. More importantly, they are 4-0 in the district with games remaining against Adair County and Taylor County.

“After we lost those games against Green County and Cumberland County and Bethlehem, I’ve been preaching confidence, confidence, confidence to the girls,” she said. “We, as coaches, have believed in them but they had to learn to believe in themselves.”

Taylor County coach Matthew Turner was disappointed in his team’s play.

“I think our girls thought they had won four district championships and that it would be easy,” he said. “I guess they thought it

would be easy. Our shot selection was not very good tonight. We didn’t move the ball and settled for 3s.”

They did not do a good job of making them, hitting only 5 of 21 on the night. Taylor County (15-7, 3-1) scored just one basket in the second quarter, a trey from Kennedy Deener with just over a minute left. The fourth period was not productive with just one field goal until a basket Kennedy Jackson in the closing seconds.

Deener was the only Lady Cardinal in double figures, tallying 11 points but had that lone field goal.

Campbellsville is on the road for the next few games, travelling to Elizabethtown tonight before going to Adair County on Friday. They are at Central Hardin next Tuesday.

Taylor County is at Marion County on Friday but will be idle until Feb. 7 when they will face Campbellsville at Citizens Bank Arena.

CARDS BOYS WIN 63-51

The boys game looked like it might be a run-away as Davier White scored all of Taylor County’s 15 first quarter points as they Cardinals took a 15-3 lead before Campbellsville got four free throws to close with eight at the first stop.

That was the story of the night with the winners mounting a double digit lead only to see the Eagles claw back to within striking distance.

Lee Colvin hit back-to-back treys and Keaton Hord hit another for the Eagles to cut Taylor County’s lead to 34-31 in the third quarter.

That’s when Layken Lyons went to work

for the Cardinals as he scored seven straight points to stretch the lead back out.

Colvin and Hord scored 17 and 13 points, respectively, to lead Campbellsville while White (26) and Lyons (24) paced Taylor County.

The Cardinals (15-4, 2-2 district) have a busy

few days as they play Marion County in Lebanon on Friday and then go back to the Roby Dome on Saturday to place Woodford County in the H&W Dukes Showcase. Taylor County is at Woodford County on Sunday before getting a few days off before entertaining Campbellsville (2-14, 0-4

Kennedy Deener scored a team-high 15 points for the Lady Cardinals. Deener was the only Taylor County player to reach double figures in the scoring column.

Lawrenceburg Water Department
Notice of Rate Changes

Pursuant to Chapter 5, Section 51.108 (D) of the Ordinances of the City of Lawrenceburg, the Consumer Price Index adjustment of rates allows an increase in retail water and sewer rate increase of 2.9% in the current fiscal year.

Chapter 5, Section 51.108 WATER SERVICE CHARGES is amended in part to read as follows:

Rates and charges for the use of the service and facilities of the system are established and prescribed, effective in the manner and upon the respective dates hereinafter set forth, as follows:

(A) Metered Water Service

(1) All water meters shall be read monthly, and the following rates and charges shall be applied to the meter-readings, and billed, collected and enforced; no distinction being made as between users and customers inside and outside the corporate limits of the city (except as indicated):

Residential Customers	
Metered Water Usage	Monthly Rate
First 2,000 gallons	\$21.01 minimum
All over 2,000 gallons	6.47 per 1,000 gallons


Commercial/Industrial Customers	
	Monthly Rate
First 2,000 gallons	\$21.01 minimum
Next 398,000 gallons	6.47 per 1,000 gallons
All over 400,000 gallons	5.89 per 1,000 gallons

(2) Water districts shall pay a rate of \$2.89 per 1,000 gallons for the first eight (8) million gallons and \$2.89 per 1,000 gallons for all gallons in excess of eight (8) million gallons.

Chapter 5, Section 51.109 SEWER SERVICE CHARGES (USER CHARGES) is amended in part to read as follows:

(D) The following schedule of user charge rates shall apply to each user of the wastewater treatment works.
