



HPD has new information on 2023 ATM robbery

The Hartford Police Department has identified a second suspect in the robbery of an ATM machine at Commonwealth Community Bank in June 2023.

Boil water advisory lifted

District customers affected by the 12" main line break on March 6 are no longer required to boil their water.

The Kentucky Division of Water and the Ohio County Water District lifted the precautionary boil water advisory on Monday for the customers in the Windy Hill and Olaton service area who had lost water after the break.

Ohio County Water new line having to be installed. On March 10, a temporary line was placed up, over and across the Cromwell bridge to provide water to the area.

The installation of the permanent waterline was completed on March 18 and crews began connecting the permanent waterline on Cromwell Road at 8:30 a.m. Customers were expected to be without Tests confirm the water for approximately water quality is safe for 6-8 hours during the reconnection process. Water was service was restored around 2:30 p.m. but the boil water remained in effect. According to OCWD, the reason for the advisory is because when pressure drops below 20 psi, the system becomes vulnerable for bacteria from groundwater or dirt that could seep into the pipe and affect the water supply. Because of this boil water advisories are issued out of an abundance of caution. OCWD said that the water tanks were disinfected pursuant to Kentucky Division of Water regulations and water samples had to be collected and tested after the tanks were filled before it could be released into the system. That was completed and the advisory was lifted.

Approximately 2,300-2,400 customers in Baizetown, Select, Manda, Arnold, Mt. Governor signs bill to lower driver's permit age to 15 into law

Kentucky teens will be able to get behind the wheel a little sooner now that Gov. Andy Beshear has signed House Bill 15 into law Tuesday.

House Bill 15 allows 15-year-olds to apply for

their driver's permit. It would also require that teens be 16 and have held their permit for 180 days before obtaining an intermediate license. They would then be required to hold their

intermediate license for 180 days and be at least 17 years old before applying for an operator's license.

"Kentucky is one of only a few states that require teenagers to be 16

for their learner's permit. House Bill 15 will change that age to 15. I signed this bill knowing it will help working families better juggle all of life's activities.

The bill goes into

effect immediately as it was passed with an emergency clause stating: "Whereas there is a need to expand economic and cultural opportunities for the Commonwealth's youth through increased

transportation options, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law."
