Dragons look to bounce back with veteran group

The South Oldham Dragons made their fifth consecutive Eighth Region Tournament appearance in 2024 but couldn't break through last year to the state tournament. However, the Dragons will have most of their roster back to reload and hope to break through in 2025.

South Oldham head coach John Cantrell will have the most seniors he's had at any point in his 10 years at South Oldham with 12. He believes the 2023 regional final appearance will help motivate the players to return to that point.

"We're going to have a lot of returners coming back, which is good, Cantrell said. "A lot of them have played and started for two or three years, so they definitely have some taste of being in the region final and semifinals. We can take the feeling from the last game last year and motivate us for the season coming up."

The seniors on the team this year are Keegan Anderson, Quin Brice, Brennan Cavnor, Dylan Ehret, Jonathon Farmer, Justin Farmer, Luke Hayden, Jacobi Hinkle, Levi Reagan, Ryder Roberson, Ethan Spurlock and Corbin Whitley. Cantrell has seen his seniors take leadership of the team.

"We've had some seniors step up," Cantrell said. "The captains are

son and Ethan Spurlock, they were freshmen. Cantrell has seen them grow into their leadership

"They've really stepped up and taken on those leadership roles and have been very vocal and leading by example and just doing the little our leaders to do in the program," Cantrell said.

Cantrell will return all of his back line and most of his midfielders for 2025. Two of those key contributors are Roberson and Anderson. Anderson scored five goals while Roberson scored three last season.

"[Anderson and Roberson] have shown real maturity and being smart on the field," Cantrell said. "We're returning our whole back line and midfield for the most part. We're kind of looking to sharpen up some mistakes from last year and not give up a lot of goals, and hopefully, find some people to score some.'

Along with Anderson, Brice and Spurlock, Cavnor and Ehret will make up the back line again. Cantrell has seen great leadership from them and buying into their roles.

'We have good size. They all have experience as seniors, and we're looking to be super sharp in the defensive third and not give up a lot of goals this year," Cantrell said.

Sophomore Ethan Briscoe will come in as the team's goalie in 2025. Cantrell has been impressed by him and saw a lot of good things from him while he played junior varsity.

"[Briscoe] has looked good, definitely has some growth to do being so young," Cantrell said. "He's a really good shot stopper, good with his feet. We're looking for him to step in and take that role and run with it."

South will lose its top three goal scorers from last year. Cantrell has been moving Spurlock around to get him more touches around the goal. He's also seen Elijah Walker improve a lot going into his junior season after scoring six goals last year. Cantrell has been impressed with freshman Judah Walker and his ability to help lead the attack.

Cantrell has seen sophomores Liam Hayden and Brennan Whitley come into their own over the offseason and expects them to help the team out this season.

"I have a couple of young guys that are good and will be fighting for some time and will swing both JV and varsity to start but could see themselves get more minutes, possibly starting and being intact on the varsity squad," Cantrell said.

Cantrell hasn't moved the goal over the last few seasons. He wants his team to be the top team in the district and make a postseason push.

"We really would like to get that number one district seed and set ourselves up," Cantrell said. "We want to go to the regional tournament, and we want to win it.'
