

# Community performances scheduled for this weekend

LONDON — With the Christmas season in full swing, there are several holiday-themed performances scheduled for this weekend.

**London Community Orchestra**  
The Community Orchestra is kicking off its 29th season on Saturday with the annual Christmas Concert at 7 p.m.  
Musical Director Jack Walker said the event will feature popular holiday songs from both the religious and secular genres.  
“Amber Hannah is our guest soloist,” Walker said. “She will be singing ‘O Holy Night’ and ‘White Christmas.’ The orchestra will be performing traditional favorites. The crowd always likes ‘Sleigh Ride’ and we will be doing medleys of other Christmas songs.”  
Walker said those attending can expect to hear “Frosty the Snowman,” “Jingle Bells,” “Silent Night” and “Joy to the World,” among others.  
“We have musicians across the region who come to play,” Walker said. “They come from Corbin, Williamsburg, Somerset and some drive down from Lexington.”  
London is the only community south of Lexington to have a community orchestra, with members being music teachers and former music students who donate their time to participate in the orchestra.  
The London Community Orchestra performs four shows each year — Christmas, Spring, Patriotic concert around July 4th and Pops concert in August.  
Admission is \$12 per person with anyone under age 18 admitted free. Tickets will be sold at the door on the night of the concert. Donations are welcomed. For more information about the London Community Orchestra, visit their website at [www.lcoky.com](http://www.lcoky.com).

**Southeast Kentucky Community Chorus**  
Sunday will mark the Southeast Kentucky Community Chorus performance at 4 p.m.  
Director Jerry Wright said the concert will feature traditional holiday music but will also highlight several members of the chorus.  
“This is a special year because this is one of the largest choruses we’ve ever had,” he said. “We have around 70 singers this year.”  
The repertoire will include a “Christmas Choral Fantasy,” new versions of traditional songs such as “Angels We Have Heard on High,” “I Wish You Christmas,” and a version of “Christ is Born” featuring a male quartet of the chorus.  
“We’re doing a rather haunting song called ‘The Work of Christmas’ and we have some songs with percussion, trumpet and two pianos,” Wright said.  
The Southeast Community Chorus was formerly known as the London Community Chorus but changed the name several years ago to reflect the inclusion of singers from Corbin, Williamsburg, Somerset and surrounding communities, Wright added.  
“We just wanted it to be more reflective of the area,” he said.  
The Southeast Community Chorus usually performs twice each year — joining the Community Orchestra for their August Pops Concert.  
Admission to the Sunday concert is free, but donations can be made at the door. Visit their Facebook page for more information.

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fortunate.  
Tracie Byers, founder and CEO of Isaiah 58:10 Ministries, said the ministry started with feeding homeless and needy people.  
“We delivered 40 meals twice a month but it kept growing and we had to go to sack lunches,” she said. “We have now served 4,086 lunches.”  
The ministry is based on the scripture of Isaiah 58:10 — “And if you spend yourselves in behalf of the hungry and satisfy the needs of the oppressed, then your light will rise in the darkness and your night will become like the noonday.”  
Byers said Isaiah 58 Ministries is launching the White Flag program which will serve needy persons from 11:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. As temperatures plunge into the freezing marks, the ministry is partnering with BudgetHost Inn to provide shelter.  
“We put as many people

there as we have money to do,” she added. “We’re currently working on a contract with the city for a warming shelter, although no contract has been signed yet.”  
White Flag includes a movement to accept, help and integrate those with mental illness to persons who understand the challenges they face. White Flag focuses on acceptance, connection and support and providing support for individuals to have a safe space to discuss their experiences. The program is open to anyone in the U.S. over 18 years old.  
But the ministry needs support of the community to continue its mission. Byers said donations are welcomed. Although no clothing and household items are accepted, food and monetary gifts are.  
“We love food donations, but you can give cash, checks, gift cards, Venmo and PayPal,” she said. “We also need volunteers to help us in the mission.”  
For more access, a Blessing Box is also located in front of the building that contains blankets and hygiene items. Persons can donate to the Blessing Box, and those in need can get items needed for their overall well-being.  
“That’s already being used,” she said, adding that

that aspect of the ministries is a partnership with the White Flag program in Corbin.
