



Rogers meets with superintendents in Kentucky's Fifth District to discuss Federal funding for education

SOMERSET, (May 14, 2025) - U.S.Rep. Harold "Hal" Rogers, Dean of the House, convened a meeting on Monday at the Center for Rural Development with superintendents from 19 school districts in southern and eastern Kentucky, as well as the Kentucky Association of School Administrators.
