### Man arrested in connection to road rage incident involving firearm

CORBIN — Ryan Gerber, 50, of Woodbine, was arrested on Thursday after a reported road rage incident earlier last week resulted in a firearm being drawn during a confrontation on Masters Street.

The encounter occurred a firearm on Mills.

Tuesday afternoon, June 3, near Hometown Bank and Snappy's restaurant in Corbin. The situation allegedly unfolded after 20-year-old Tate Mills attempted to merge lanes — prompting an aggressive reaction from Gerber, who is accused of pulling out

Mills told media that Gerber refused to let him merge, and slammed on his breaks. When Mills honked his horn, Gerber allegedly exited his vehicle and approached Mills.

In a video posted in a local Facebook group, Gerber is seen exiting his truck and

confronting Mills. He then goes back to his truck, and retrieves a firearm before getting back in.

The Knox County Sheriff's Department confirmed the arrest on Thursday, June 5. Gerber was charged with second-degree wanton endangerment and menacing.

He was booked into the Knox County Detention Center and released shortly thereafter upon posting a \$1,000 bond.

Gerber was scheduled to be arraigned Monday morning, the outcome of which was not available at press

### KSP recovers stolen vehicle after pursuit leads to cliffside rescue

CORBIN — A pursuit involving a stolen wrecker ended in a cliffside rescue Thursday night, after Kentucky State Police and multiple agencies responded to a series of events around Cumberland Falls.

At approximately 9:30 p.m., KSP received a tip regarding the location of a wrecker reported stolen out of Laurel County. The vehicle was found parked near the falls by Park Ranger Jones, who approached it and discovered a male driver and female passenger inside.

As the ranger attempted to identify the individuals, the driver took off, ramming and severely damaging the park ranger's emergency vehicle. A pursuit was soon initiated by McCreary

County Sheriff's Deputy Dustin Ridner.
