BARBOURVILLE — “Tonight is more than history,” Mayor David Thompson said, addressing a crowd gathered to honor 225 years of community and resilience.

On Saturday, Barbourville celebrated its 225th anniversary as a city in Kentucky. Put together by Barbourville Tourism and the Knox Historical Museum, the night began as history often does — with the past.

Actors from Tri-County Mystery Meets presented different people from Barbourville’s early days. Jennie Walker came alive in the performance of one troupe member. The sheriff of Knox County in 1929 brought law and order for one more night in 2025 Barbourville. Walker was the first female sheriff of Knox County, though

Corbin City Commissioners approve bids, insurance rates

Also hold first reading of downtown entertainment ordinance

CORBIN — Corbin City Commission held a special-called meeting last Wednesday to address The Corbin Center expansion project, key insurance approvals and a first reading of a new entertainment ordinance.

During the meeting, commis-

sioners approved the minutes from the regular May 19 meeting and took action on sealed bids submitted for the Corbin Expansion Project.

The city of Corbin received numerous bids from construction companies for the expansion project, but ultimately awarded the contract to McKnight & Associates.

McKnight & Associates’ bid

amount was \$4.5 million, the lowest out of all of the bids.

A letter sent to the city from engineering firm MSE of Kentucky was also read by City Clerk Tori Brock.


