Lady Wildcats looking to get back to 13th Region Tournament after absence this past season

CORBIN — Take away the COVID-19 impacted 2020 season when the 13th Region Tournament was cancelled, Nikki Hendrix's Lynn Camp Lady Wildcats missed playing in the regional tournament for the first time since 2014 after falling in semifinal action of the 51st District Tournament this spring.

Contending for both the district and regional championships has been the norm for Lynn Camp since Hendrix took over the reigns of the Lady Wildcats softball program.

But this season was a tad bit different with Lynn Camp having to overcome the graduation of key players in 2024.

Hendrix's squad continued to compete throughout the season and picked up some impressive wins before finishing with a 7-16 mark.

Lynn Camp started the season with a 4-0 record,

but followed with a six-game losing skid before ending the 2025 campaign with a seven-game losing skid.

The Lady Wildcats picked up two wins over Jellico, along with victories over Somerset Christian and Powell County that saw Hendrix's squad score a team-record 30 runs. They also had two wins over Williamsburg and defeated Barbourville as well.

Charity Steele (.525 batting average), Cambree Prewitt (.429), Aniyah Hamilton (.326) and Molly Weirman are the seniors that graduated off the squad while players such as Lauren Partin (.533), Lily Henize (.484), Emma Burnette (.444), Bailey Martin (.435), Julie Moore (.400), Madison Weymers (.306), Bella Gambrell, Ella Frazier, Lorelai Prewitt and Gabby Thomas will be returning next season.

Moore led Lynn Camp with six wins and a save while Thomas had a win.

LONDON — Corbin's Danni Foley and North Laurel's Saige McClure were named to the Senior East All-Star squad while South Laurel's Bailey Frazier and Audrey Likins were named to the Junior East All-Star squad.

McClure helped lead North Laurel to a 29-7 mark, 49th District and 13th Region championships, and an appearance in the KHSAA Softball State Tournament while batting .487.

She finished with six home runs, 55 RBI, 13 doubles and three triples while stealing 16

bases.

Both Frazier and Likins led South Laurel to a 26-6 record, a 50th District championship, and an appearance in the 13th Region Tournament.

Frazier batted .505 with 51 hits, one home run, eight doubles, three triples, 13 RBI, 58 runs scored and 36 stolen bases.

Likins batted .235 with 23 hits, three doubles, one triple, 11 RBI, and 12 runs scored. She posted a 5-1 mark in the pitcher's circle, striking out 15 batters while finishing with a 3.41 ERA.
