The Winchester Police Department last

week sent the following press release, signed by Chief Travis Thompson.

"On June 27, the Winchester Police Department responded to the Red Roof Inn, 1100 Interstate Drive, for a welfare check on a female. Patrol officers located the female deceased in one of the rooms at that location, and a death Investigation was initiated. Detective Sergeant Matthew Reed began overseeing the investigation. Since that time, Sergeant Reed and WPD staff have worked closely with Kentucky State Police, the Lexington DEA field office, Clark and Powell County Coroner's offices, and the 39th Judicial District Commonwealth's Attorney's Office of Powell County to thoroughly investigate deaths involving Brian Phillip Epperson in multiple jurisdictions. "After consultation with the United

States District Court, Eastern District of Kentucky, Central Division Lexington, on October 16, Sergeant Reed and a DEA task force officer testified before a federal grand jury in Lexington. As a result of these testimonies, Brian Phillip Epperson has been indicted on two counts of knowingly and intentionally distributing a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of methamphetamine, a schedule II controlled substance, the use of which resulted in the overdose deaths of two victims, in violation of 21 U.S.C. 841 (a)(1) and (b)(1)(C). Each count will carry a minimum sentence of life in prison, if convicted. Mr. Epperson remains at the Clark County Detention Center and is now in federal custody.

"This has been a very long and indepth investigation that required multiple resources, some outside of our capability. I am very thankful to our local, state, and federal partners at the Kentucky State Police, DEA, Coroner's offices, and the Commonwealth's Attorney's Office for their assistance. I would also like to recognize Detective Sergeant Matthew Reed, who oversees our general investigations, for his hard work in a very complex, difficult case."
