OF STREET-LEGAL SPECIAL PURPOSE VEHICLES ON CERTAIN HIGHWAYS AND ROADWAYS WITHIN THE INCORPORATED AREA OF THE CITY OF PRINCETON. KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the 2025 Kentucky General Assembly passed Senate Bill 63 (2025 Ky. Acts Chapter 89, hereinafter "the Act"), which allows for the operation of street-legal special purpose rehicles on certain highways and roadways within the Commonwealth of Kentucky if authorized by ordinance of the local government within whose jurisdictional boundaries such a public way is 2025; and WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Princeton, Kentucky, wishes to take advantage of the home-rule authority granted in said legislation, and allow for the operation of streetegal special purpose vehicles on certain public ways within the ncorporated area of the City of Princeton, Kentucky in accordnce with the Act and the provisions of this Ordinance. NOW, **THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Princeton, Kentucky as follows: SECTION 1. Definitions The definitions as set forth in Section 1, subsection (1) of 2025 Ky. Acts Chapter 89 (hereinafter "the Act"), and as may be amended from time to time by the Kentucky General Assembly, are hereby dopted and incorporated by reference as if set out in full herein SECTION 2. Designated Highways; Restrictions A. Street-legal special purpose vehicles shall be allowed, to the extent permited by the Act, on all public highways and roadways, or portions thereof, that are located within the incorporated area of the City of Princeton, Kentucky and maintained and/or under the control of the City of Princeton, Kentucky, Caldwell County Fiscal Court or Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, where the speed limit is fifty ive (55) miles per hour or less. B. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, the operation of Street-legal special purpose vehicles upon the authorized public highways and oadways within the City of Princeton, Kentucky shall be subject o the following restrictions: i. Operation shall only be permitted during the hours between sunrise and sunset; ii. No passenger shall be permitted to ride in any cargo area; and iii. No trailers shall be attached to any Street-legal special purpose vehicle while operating upon the public highways and roadways. SEC-TION 3. Compliance with Federal and State Law Notwithstand ng anything contained herein to the contrary, the operation of a street-legal special purpose vehicle on a public way in the incorporated area of the City of Princeton, Kentucky, shall at all times comply in all respects with any applicable federal and/or state law, statute, rule or regulation, as may be currently in effect, and as may be promulgated or amended from time to time, including, but not limited to, those establishing minimum and required oper ator, safety, insurance and registration requirements. SECTION 4. Violations Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a violation and punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per incident, in addition to any other penalties that may be imposed pursuant to federal and/or state law. SECTION 5. Jurisdictional Applicability The provisions and authorities contained and granted herein shall only apply within the incorporated area of the City of Princeton, Kentucky. SECTION 6. Severability If any provision contained herein is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unconstitutional, or otherwise unenforceable, such a determination shall not affect or impair the enforceability of the remaining provisions. SECTION 7. Effective Date This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication. So passed on first reading the 4th day of August, 2025.
