## **Nicholas County Fiscal Court discuss industrial park** waterline, budgets, and more during monthly meeting

Members of the Nicholas County Fiscal Court, along with Judge-Executive Steve Hamilton and County Attorney Dawn Letcher, met on Thursday, April 17, 2025, at 9:00am, at the Nicholas County Courthouse for their regularly scheduled monthly meeting. The meeting was broadcast in its entirety on the Carlisle Mercury Facebook page.

Judge-Exec. Hamilton called the meeting

to order with a prayer from Mrs. Letcher, roll call with all magistrates present, approval of the minutes from last month's meeting, acknowledgment of the receipt of the monthly departmental reports, approval of the monthly bills, and approval for permission to bid out hay and other materials, which will be opened at the May meeting.

The court approved the Kentucky Dept. of Transportation - Rural Secondary Program Recommendations for Fiscal Year 2025-2026, which includes asphalt resurfacing on Cane Run Road and East Union Road.

Members of the Nicholas County Cooperative Extension gave a presentation regarding what they do in the county, and their goals. They

also spoke about a land use request for the purpose of constructing another building for co-op usage, which would be owned by the court. They also provided a packet of information for the magistrates, including aerial views of the current property, as well, and ideas that they would like to see implemented.

The court approved the Nicholas County Soil Conservation budget, as presented by Andrew Fugitt, who spoke about all the new programs that have been implemented in Nicholas County, including dead animal approval.

The court discussed a water line extension project on a dead-end sec-
