The board tabled discussions regarding an upcoming project Goose Creek and also tabled a discussion regarding a customer dispute on Pleasant Springs, as well, to receive further information each issue.

Paul Reynolds, from Bluegrass Engineering, spoke to the board about the Goose Creek project, and said a letter had been sent to the fiscal court regarding plans and specifications for the installation of a 2000 foot 4" line, which has Division of Water approval. A pre-construction meeting will be scheduled with the developer/contractor, and the board is waiting on further word from the fiscal court.

Mr. Reynolds also gave some updates regarding Phase 12. The project includes a pump station at Blue Licks, which is currently under construction, and is looking good, and is going as planned, with a tentative completion date for the end of August.

are looking into funding for the project with the Bluegrass ADD and the EPA, as well as looking at all avenues regarding funding. The Bartersville tank is not in Phase 13. but the waterline on US 68 is, but not in spe-

The board also discussed a possible wholesale water rate from the Western Fleming Water District. The board also met a few days later, at the water board office, for a special-called meeting for further discussion.

The board went over a packet called "Analysis Recommendations Wholesale Water Rate," provided from the Western Fleming Water District, dated March 5, 2025, prepared by Robert K. Miller, from the Kentucky Rural Water Association. The packet contains

fied every three years.

Western Fleming County Water District requested that Kentucky Rural Water Association perform a whole water rate study based upon current expenses.

The computed wholesale rate is \$3.95 per thousand gallons. This represents an increase of \$1.76 per thousand gallons or 80.37% over the current rate of \$2.19. This represents a significant increase which indicates that a phase-in over multiple years may be appropriate for consideration."

Mr. Reynolds and the board discussed the possible wholesale rate increase and raised multiple questions and options regarding the proposed increase. The Nicholas County Water District rates paid to Western Fleming have gone up steadily over the years, from \$1.63, to \$2.14, to the current \$2.19 per thousand gallons.

Mr. Reynolds also said a meeting has been set up at Buffalo Trail to get their thoughts on the matter, as well.

The meeting was subsequently adjourned.
