the coming months will be set up at Harrison Harvesting, as well.

Vendors and visitors took advantage of the nice, mild, Spring weather on that Saturday, to sell and purchase various items, which included locally grown, in-season produce; local honey and beeswax items; homemade baked items of all sorts; fresh eggs; fresh homemade homemade donuts;



jams, jellies, and butters; homemade soaps and homemade crafts; locally and pasture raised chicken.

Carlisle City Council discuss 3rd quarter budget and more at May meeting

Members of the Carlisle City Council, along Mayor Ronnie Clark, met on Monday, May 12, 2025, at 7:00pm, at City Hall, for their regularly scheduled monthly meeting, which was broadcast live on the Carlisle Mercury Facebook page.

Mayor Clark called the meeting to order with a moment of silence, roll call with only one council member absent, approval of the minutes of the last council meeting held in April, approval of the payroll transfers, and approval of the May bills.

The council approved to raise the cities Visa credit card limit from \$5,000.00 to \$10,000.00. Mayor Clark said they actually hit the previous limit of \$5,000.00 on some months and explained that in order to pay for hotel rooms while on training trips, or ordering from Amazon, the credit limit would have to be raised, which the council agreed to.

Each council member received a copy of the 3rd quarter budget, which will be approved at next month's meeting. Mayor Clark went through the budget and said they the city was running the same as usual, with an excellent cash flow,

paid. He also mentioned that the city has assets worth \$16 million dollars and that they only had around \$300,000.00 in debt.

The mayor mentioned all the upcoming events in the city in the next few months, including car shows, the Blackberry Festival, Saturday in Carlisle, and more. He said these events were usually very well attended, and that the numerous visitors to the city were a great thing, especially so they could see how well the city has been so well maintained. The mayor also spoke about KET-TV coming to visit the city, and that he was going to meet with them as well to speak
