

## Resolution for “Show Support of US Troops” yellow ribbon project approved by City Council

The Beattyville City Council met in regular session on Monday evening, March 9, 2026 at 6 p.m. at City Hall. Council members Ronnie Stamper, Sam Cockerham, Glenna Cummins and Charlotte Hogan as well as Mayor Scott Jackson were in attendance. Council members Mitch Cornelius and Savannah Mays were absent. After member Sam Cockerham opened the meeting with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, the meeting was called to order.

First on the agenda

was Katie Wilborn of the Kentucky Heritage Council who addressed the Council on the Historic Preservation Tax Incentives. She told those in attendance that there were two types of programs, one state and one federal. She went on to describe who was eligible, who would benefit and how to apply. The tax credit would be available for all building types as long as they were on the Historic Register, which most of downtown Beattyville is. Ms. Wilborn said money was awarded in May

and June and the budget for the program was 100 million dollars. Teresa Mays, Main Street Director, said there were 37 buildings in downtown that would qualify for the tax credit if the expenses were qualified. Examples of work would be roofs, gutters, windows, painting, etc. with a minimum of \$20,000 per project.

Paul Nesbitt reported that his company was continuing ongoing projects such as Phase 2 and 3 of the waterplant rehab.

Mike Smith of KRADD said that they

were working on CBDG grant applications and that funds had been released for the water plant rehab.

Glenna Cummins made a motion with Ronnie Stamper seconding to pass a resolution to “Show Support of US Troops” yellow ribbon project.

Project Prom had submitted a request for a donation. Ronnie Stamper made a motion with Sam Cockerham seconding to give them \$100.

The 2025 Audit Report was briefly discussed.

Ronnie Stamper made a motion with Sam Cockerham seconding to approve the minutes of the last meeting.

Main Street Director Teresa Mays gave a brief description of what was going on on Main Street including a meeting with Bob Perkins and Mayor Jackson to secure a planner for downtown development. She also gave an overview of what was happening on Main Street.

Police Chief Cody Sparks reported that he had no report for his department this month.

Public Works Director Ferrell Wise reported that his department had received 86 work orders and had completed 78 for water and sewer.

Ronnie Stamper made the motion with Charlotte Hogan seconding to approve the financial report as submitted.

Mayor Jackson reported to the Council that he had purchased a bucket truck from Cody Turner for \$5200.

The meeting was then adjourned.
